YOUR RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES As a Supportive Housing Resident

1. Do I live in Office of Mental Health (OMH)-licensed Supportive Housing?

You live in Supportive Housing if you live in:

- Transitional Supported Living Residences (Level II), such as a MICA Community Residence (MICA CR),
- Supervised Community Residence (Super CR),
- Community Residence SRO (CR/SRO) or Apartment Treatment; or
- A permanent residence that is part of a Community-Care Model.

2. What rights do I have as a resident of supportive housing? Your rights include:

- To get your **full personal needs allowance** on time.
- To get a clearly written residency agreement, which include:
 - the terms of the agreement;
 - the services that the program should provide;
 - \circ the residence fees;
 - the payment due dates;
 - the responsibility of the residents;
 - the policy about returning after a hospitalization; and
 - the terms of the grievance procedure and termination policy.
- To have access to a residents' council or other ways to **participate in making the house rules** or in other matters that affect how the residence operates.

3. What are my responsibilities as a resident of supportive housing?

Your responsibilities include:

- To respect the other residents' quiet enjoyment of the shared areas;
- To not negatively affect the habitability of the residence;
- To not create health or safety hazards for yourself or others;
- To pay the residency fees in full and on time;
- To follow the residency agreement and house rules;
- To give at least 30 days written notice when you want to end your residency
